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Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling



If the last syllable of a word is stressed and ends with one consonant letter and one vowel letter before it (e.g. stop), the final consonant letter is doubled before any suffix beginning with a 'vowel letter' is added. It is not doubled if the syllable is unstressed. For example stop \rightarrow stopped
